Distinguished History Is Model For Addressing Future Challenges

I have been reflecting on the history of this organization and the FFA as our new year begins. That reflection recalls challenges faced by agriculture education and the FFA in the past. The vocational agriculture program (as it was known at the time) and FFA were eliminated at my high school and many others shortly after I graduated due to school budget constraints. At such times Ag Ed leaders and instructors rose to challenges with innovative thinking and hard work. The formation of the FFA Alumni Association is one result. The result of their effort is what we today consider an educational model second to none and the greatest youth development organization in the nation.

As our communities, state and nation faces economic challenges unprecedented in most of our lifetimes it is our turn to rise to present challenges. The FFA Alumni has a critical role to play in the continued success of Ag Ed and the FFA. Through continuing material and volunteer support of our Ag Ed instructor/FFA advisors and FFA members, and effective advocacy for the program with local and state government decision-makers we can see Ag Ed and FFA weather this storm too.

There are currently a number of positive developments on which we can build our case. Science credit for high school agriculture courses allows students to meet core academic graduation requirements without having to give up an elective agriculture course. With state legislation again introduced to further increase math and science graduation requirements FFA Alumni can work with local agriculture instructors to advocate for the adoption of qualified Ag courses for science credit by local school districts. The Wisconsin Agriculture Education and Workforce Development Council is already raising public awareness of the importance to our economy of Wisconsin's \$51 billion agriculture industry and the critical need for trained employees to maintain that industry. The council will coordinate employee training needs of businesses in various segments of agriculture with training provided in our high schools and state technical college and university system schools. Every Ag education department and community in Wisconsin stands

to gain by the success of this council. Nationally, education leaders are focusing on STEM—science, technology, engineering, and math curriculum that is considered essential to preparing today's students for careers of the future. There seems to be increasing understanding of the potential for curricula such as agriculture and FFA to contribute to that goal. So what was considered a nice but not necessary curriculum targeting a dwindling proportion of the school population is being increasingly viewed as a critical educational element in state economic development and having the "right stuff" to move students toward meaningful, satisfying careers of the future. Through volunteering, advocating, and cheerleading FFA Alumni can help write a new chapter in the legacy of agriculture education and FFA. Let's take up the challenge.

Convention Wrap-Up:

A big thank you and job well done to the Section 6 and 10 convention planning committee and their leaders, co-chairs Sandy and Don Larsen and Kevin Larsen. Approximately 300 Alumni members registered for the 2009 convention "Making Headlines in 2009" at the Ho-Chunk Hotel in Baraboo. The three fundraising auctions raised \$20,000. Congratulations to the award winners recognized during the convention. Plans are rapidly moving forward for the 2010 Convention that will take place February 12 and 13 at the Holiday Inn in Manitowoc hosted by Section 8 & 9.

The National FFA Alumni will be hosting the State Leader's Conference in Montrose, CO July 15-19 where all attendees are invited to learn how to "Say It, Do It, Live It!" All FFA Alumni members can attend this dynamic four-day conference designed to gather local and state FFA Alumni leaders for workshops, updates, and idea sharing! With registration, participants will receive conference supplies, local transportation, four nights/five days of hotel stay (double occupancy), and the majority of meals. Transportation to and from the conference site is the responsibility of each attendee. Each state association may send one official representative who pays a reduced fee; the balance is covered by a \$200 SLC grant awarded by the National FFA Alumni Association. Additional Alumni members are encouraged to attend! Spouses and family members are welcome to attend for a special fee, which includes lodging, tours, group meals, and social activities.

Participants are encouraged to make travel arrangements, so they will arrive at the event hotel between 3 p.m. (hotel check-in time) and 6 p.m. on Wednesday, July 15, and depart by check-out time (Noon) on Sunday, July 19. Air travel should be arranged to Montrose, CO, Regional Airport (Airport code MTJ). The 2009 SLC conference kickoff dinner and the opening session will begin at 7 p.m. on July 15.

WI FFA Alumni Committee Recruitment

One of the ways that Wisconsin FFA Alumni members can learn more about state activities is to serve on a statewide committee. The duties of the various committees are listed here. Some committees have a designated membership due to current policy or officer positions. The other committees are open to any member. If you are interested in serving on a committee, please contact Executive Director Jayme Buttko.

Executive Committee

- Serves as the administrative committee of the Association, transacting business between regular Council meetings as authorized in the By-Laws; or by action of the Council.
- Meets as required to address issues and make recommendations to the Council.
- Reviews agenda for Council meetings prior to distribution to Council members.
- Judges applications and selects recipients for the WLC scholarships supported by the Association.

Finance Committee

- Establish the annual operating budget to be presented to the membership at the annual business meeting of the Association for approval.
- Periodically monitor the current operating budget.
- Annually review the performance of invested assets of FFA Alumni Association.
- Review the investment strategy and vendor performance periodically and recommend changes to the Council as appropriate
- Periodically review compensation and reimbursement policies and recommend changes to the Council as appropriate.

Awards Committee

- Promote member and affiliate participation in the awards programs.
- Annually review award programs and recommend changes to the Council as appropriate.
- Recruit and orient judges for awards programs. Work with Executive Secretary to coordinate judging of awards.
- Assist with awards presentations at the annual convention.

Resolutions/By-Laws Committee

- Solicit resolutions from members, affiliates, and Council members and committees for presentation at the annual business meeting.
- Review, format, and present resolutions at the annual business meeting, including coordinating printing of resolutions in the business meeting program.
- Periodically review by-laws and recommend changes to the membership at the annual business meeting.
- Accept suggestions to by-law changes from Association members, review, and prepare for presentation to the membership at the annual business meeting.

Membership Committee

- Generate ideas for retaining and increasing membership and carry them out.
- Support and assist sectional representatives with member recruitment, and reactivation of inactive affiliates and organization of new affiliates.
- Work with Executive Secretary on annual roster update process.
- Work with Executive Secretary to monitor affiliate roster completion. Communicate delinquent affiliates to sectional representatives for follow up.

Communications/Promotions

- Establish an aggressive public relations program to sell the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Association vision, mission, and goals to our members and increase the awareness and understanding of our organization by the general public.
- Evaluate promotional booth and update as needed with effective messages geared for the variety of audiences it will be used with.
- Work with the Executive Secretary to coordinate use and staffing of the promotional booth at the Wisconsin FFA Convention, WAAE conference, Wisconsin FFA Alumni Convention, and other appropriate gatherings.
- Work with the Executive Secretary to periodically review and update the Association web site to maintain its currency and effectiveness in communicating our message to members and the general public.

State FFA Alumni Convention Committee

- Serve as liaison between local convention planning committees and the Council.
- Provide continuity in convention planning over time
- Insure that all provisions of the current Convention Policy are being followed by the convention planning committees.
- Annually review the Association Convention Policy and recommend revisions to the Council as needed.
- Advise and assist local convention planning committees as needed or requested.
- Membership is to include: President as chair, one other state executive committee member, two past convention planning executive committee members, and no more than two additional at-large members. The association Vice President and Executive Secretary will serve as ex officio members of the committee.

Program Development Committee

- Evaluate needs, coordinate and organize orientation and leadership training for the Alumni Council and leadership training for Wisconsin FFA Alumni members.
- Periodically review the FFA Alumni Handbook and recommend changes to the Council.
- Work with the Executive Secretary to update the FFA Alumni Handbook as needed and inform affiliates of the availability of updates on the Alumni web site.
- Periodically review Wisconsin FFA Alumni mission and vision statements and goals. Coordinate revisitation of the mission and vision at a determined interval to insure continued relevancy.

Past President Committee

- Recruit candidates for the position of Council vice-chair.
- Support and advise the Executive Committee and Council as needed and requested.

Fundraising Committee

- Seek out, evaluate, and recommend to the Council potential state Alumni fundraising activities.
- Coordinate and manage state Alumni fundraisers.

Legion of Merit Awards Due

The purpose of the Legion of Merit Citation is to recognize National FFA Alumni members who provide leadership and spend their own time and energies to help build the National FFA Alumni Association. Legion of Merit Award winners are recognized at the National FFA Alumni Convention. Forms can be downloaded from the Wisconsin or National FFA websites.

To qualify for the Legion of Merit Citation, a National FFA Alumni member must enroll 15 new or renewed National FFA Alumni annual members or five new life members for the current membership year. The award will be based on membership submitted by the May 15 roster deadline date and all applications must be received in the **National FFA Alumni office with postmark date no later than May 15**.
